




Board Announces Names of New Catholic Schools

The Board of Trustees was delighted to announce the names of two new Catholic schools. At the April 28 Board meeting, Trustees approved Joan Carr Catholic Elementary/Junior High School (Keswick) and Father Michael McCaffery Catholic High School (Heritage Valley). "The overwhelming response we received was truly heartwarming," said Board Chair Sandra Palazzo. "The tributes to the two school namesakes that are being brought forward were unique, personal, and beautiful testaments of the contributions of these members of our Catholic community in Edmonton and beyond."

The provincial government announced the new schools last year and Edmonton Catholic Schools put the call out to the public for help naming them in January. The Division received more than 300 submissions from the community.



Joan Carr Catholic Elementary/Junior High School will open in September 2022 with space for more than 900 students, while construction will begin on Father Michael McCaffery Catholic High School this fall and once built, it will have a capacity of 1,300.

Reminder to School Councils: Enrol for ASCA Membership Fees

School Councils are reminded to enrol for the Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) membership for the upcoming year by visiting the ASCA website and completing the online "Request for Membership" without payment form. Your membership will become effective immediately upon completion of the application. You may do this at any time during the year. Schools are no longer automatically enrolled as was the case in previous years.

ASCA member school councils are entitled to:

- Submit a Proposed Advocacy Resolution for policy consideration;
- Vote on agenda items at General Meetings of the Association;
- Speak to any agenda item at General Meetings of the Association;
- Vote for candidates running for President, Vice President, and Director positions;
- Nominate an eligible parent school council member as a candidate for the Board of Directors;
- Participate on Board committees as invited;
- Participate on the School Council Engagement Task Force;
- Pay reduced fees, if any, for attendance at ASCA events;
- Examine the books and records of the Association.

Introducing Our Common Home

The Board of Trustees was pleased to share the good news that our Division would be consolidating all of its departments, with the exception of our Facilities Services, under one roof to share in a common home. The new space occupies what is formally known as the 50th Street Atria at 9405 – 50 Street and will provide centralized Division administrative services. In making this decision, we are not only fulfilling a commitment to maximize funding to go to our schools and classrooms rather than supporting old and inefficient infrastructure, but also reinforcing the importance of our Catholic presence. With the move, we will realize a minimum of \$1 million dollars of cost savings per year over the next 10 years, money that will be redirected to our schools and classrooms.

We look forward to the opportunity to have all our staff in one central location to work and live out our calling to a faith-filled life of service.











A Year in Review: Trusteeship in a Pandemic

Like all Canadians, our Trustees had the unique experience of staying connected this year with our schools, staff, students, and parent communities in a pandemic. We worked hard to be responsive to your needs without being able to speak face-to-face. We met virtually for meetings with our MLAs and other government officials. We joined our schools via Microsoft Teams for celebrations and school council meetings. When it was deemed safe to do so, we served our schools in physically distanced situations to volunteer for hot lunches or clean up our schoolyards. Trustees were challenged to dig deep and get creative to figure out ways to maintain connections.

Throughout the year we advocated on behalf of all Edmonton Catholic Schools staff, students, and families to support all facets of student learning impacted by the pandemic. We began by calling for additional funding to ensure the safety of all students and staff while we mitigated the challenges of the new COVID-19 reality. We continued our advocacy efforts by calling on the Province to have all school-based staff be at the top of the priority list for COVID-19 vaccines in the early phases of vaccination delivery. We've also been fighting hard and continuing to push for funding for much needed capital projects, as student enrolment is anticipated to grow by 12% over the next 5-years.

Trustees also pivoted our public engagement activities online and provided a variety of support and advocacy virtually, through dialogue with our student voice representatives and via events such as the Community of School Councils (COSC) Engagement Sessions, the ASBA (Alberta School Board Association meetings and Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) Conference and AGM

Although Trusteeship looked a little different this year, we continued to make decisions that were responsive to the needs of our schools, staff. students, and families.

Launching the Playground Initiatives Fund at St. Maria Goretti

Trustees joined Chief Superintendent Robert Martin and Superintendent John Fiacco at St. Maria Goretti Catholic School for the launch of the Division's Playground Initiatives Fund. This program will allow our students more and equitable access to different spaces and places in their outside environments and adds accessible pathways to our school yards, which will connect schools right to the play equipment. Over the summer, nine more schools are scheduled to receive more accessible pathways to their playgrounds, paving the way to more inclusive play in our Division's school communities.









Capital Announcement: ECSD Receives Funding for New High School

Education Minister Adriana LaGrange and Infrastructure Minister Prasad Panda joined Trustees at Holy Trinity Catholic High School in March as the Province announced funding for a new Edmonton Catholic high school as part of the government of Alberta's Capital Plan announcements.

"We are extremely pleased the provincial government has responded to our critical need for a new high school in northwest Edmonton. Nearly 1,400 high school students in Castle Downs/Dunluce will now have a Catholic school option in their community," said Board Chair Sandra Palazzo.

\$268 million was earmarked by the Province of Alberta for new schools and education upgrades and included the funding to design a desperately needed high school in northwest Edmonton in the Castle Downs/Dunluce area for Edmonton Catholic. This project has been on our Division Capital Plan since 2018 and will provide a Catholic high school north of Archbishop O'Leary, which is currently operating at 116% capacity. The site of the announcement, Holy Trinity, is currently undergoing a major modernization. The project was announced by the Province in 2015.











Edmonton Catholic Schools Community of School Councils Engagement Sessions

On March 15 and 16, 2021, the Board of Trustees engaged with the executive members of our School Councils and the administration teams of our schools to gather insights on the four Board Priorities for our various planning endeavors. This rich opportunity for stakeholder engagement was the first of its kind for our Division and provided invaluable feedback on the practices and supports that our families feel are of greatest value in the education of their children. The four priorities are Growing in Faith, Student Success, An Excellent Place to Work and Learn, and Building our Future Together. The report for the Community of School Councils (COSC) was presented at the Public Board Meeting on April 28 and can be found in the Board Agenda Package by clicking here and scrolling to the report. The overarching themes from this engagement were used at the Division level to inform the Division Plan for Continuous Growth and the Division Budget. Individual schools will use their specific results to inform their School Plan for Continuous Growth and their School Budget.
