#### We Are Called to Serve: Your Board of Trustees




## Christmas Wishes From Your ECSD Board of Trustees and Chief Superintendent

# Trustees in the Community

#### Celebrating the St. Edmund Modernization

Board Chair Sandra Palazzo and Vice-Chair Lisa Turchansky joined Chief Superintendent Robert Martin and Superintendents Bouma, Fiacco, and Naccarato as St. Edmund Catholic Elementary/Junior High School celebrated a rededication ceremony in honour of the major modernization that was completed at the school in 2020.

Trustees had an opportunity to tour the upgraded classrooms, speak with staff about the importance of modernizing schools in established communities, and meet with the construction and architect teams responsible for the work. The St. Edmund modernization project was an important objective for Trustees in 2018 and was one that was lobbied for strongly with government.

Upgrades to the school included a new foods lab, music room, CTS room, fitness area and learning commons, as well as new washrooms, classroom teaching boards and LEDs. The modernization also addressed traffic and parking congestion, by optimizing the traffic flow with a new drop off zone. The modernization began in March of 2018,

Get the curriculum to an acceptable standard, find supports for our staff and students as mental health becomes more challenging, and keep publicly funded Catholic education a leader in the Province.


#### What biblical person do you relate to most and why?
